
#### **Pack Spotlight**

## How can communities help each other in times of difficulty?



Following unrest in parts of the UK over the summer, this pack explored clean-up efforts in Middlesbrough, after the town was affected by damage from protests that turned violent. Children explored the significance of their communities and considered how they can support others.

## What can we learn from the stories of others?



This Special Pack reflected on the achievements of Refugee Paralympic Team member, Zakia Khudadadi, who won a bronze medal for Para taekwondo. This news encouraged children to think about the inspiration the Games can provide, and to learn more about Zakia's background.

## How important is it to know about the author behind the book?



Coinciding with the start of Black History Month, this pack explored the 2024 theme, 'Reclaiming Narratives', and news of Penguin's book vending machine at a school in Scotland. We explored the Lit in Colour reading lists, which prompted discussions about the power of learning about authors and sharing stories.

## Why do people give gifts?



Gifts were the topic of conversation for this pack, following criticism of Prime Minister Sir Keir Starmer for accepting free gifts, including tickets for Arsenal football matches and a Taylor Swift concert. This news led to wider discussion about gratitude and the purpose of gift-giving, along with the rules government ministers must follow when accepting gifts.

## How important is it to know about the author behind the book?


It is important to know the author behind the book because they might relate it to their culture or even what has happened in their life or where they are from, their happiness and their struggles.

## Spook-tastic Decorations

Create some
